What is an essay? It is a small essay on one particular subject that expresses the author's individual attitude toward the topic. The basic rule of an essay is to show something new about the topic.

The ability to write an essay is of great benefit to the author because it trains him/her to express his/her thoughts competently and according to all the rules, material in groups, link the necessary information in a logical chain, be able to analyze, find cause and effect connections, explain concepts by examples, give evidence to his/her conclusions, be able to use a scientific style of speech, be able to use terminology.

Where to begin.

Before you start writing an essay, you need to have a clear idea, find a goal, and identify sources of material for the research.

To overcome the creative crisis and speed up the writing process, it is necessary to use the technique of freewriting, it is necessary to write down everything that comes to mind on the topic, without observing the rules of grammar, spelling and punctuation, not to edit the text.

You should start your work by writing the main part. When the main idea is disclosed, writing the introductory part will no longer cause difficulties.

You can start writing an essay with a question that will be answered later on.

Structure of writing an essay on social studies

Introduction 20%

Main part 60%

Conclusion 20%

1. Thesis - main quotation

A clear understanding of the meaning of the chosen quotation is required. The ability to express your own opinion about it, to be able to prove your position, as well as to challenge the statement or to agree with it, giving the necessary arguments, is appreciated. 2. Identifying the Problem of the Statement

It is necessary to point out that this problem is extremely topical in modern conditions. In order to write the essay correctly, you need to repeat and voice the problem more often while writing this work. Then the full disclosure of the content of the problem will come out, and you will not make the most frequent mistake

when writing an essay, when, being carried away by reflection, you inadvertently go beyond the problem.
3. The meaning of the statement [Custom Writings](#).

You should reveal the value and meaning of the quotation without repeating it verbatim. You need to express your interpretation of the main idea of the quote, to describe your personal understanding and feelings about the statement. It is necessary to strive to understand the topic, to feel it, that is, to conduct a thorough research and then it will not be difficult to interpret the problem in an original way. 4. Your attitude towards the statement.

You should know that it is better to agree with a quote from a famous smart author than to enter into an argument with him or her or refute his or her quote. It is much easier than arguing and confirming your point of view, because you will have to pay more scrupulous attention to details, examine the statement from different positions. 5-6. Argumentation .

To prove your opinion on a problem, you must find the necessary arguments, that is, arguments, recall the main terms, theoretical principles.

There are two levels of justification of one's opinion:

Theoretical level - the basis is the use of basic concepts, terms, contradictions, the opinion of scientists, as well as the direction of scientific thought.

The empirical level is based on your own acquired experience, and the use of examples from historical events and literature.

Here it is necessary to accurately track the possibility of departing from the topic, for this purpose it is necessary to observe the adequacy of the arguments. 7. Conclusion .

The formulation of the conclusion is the summing up of all reasoning, confirms or disproves the correctness of the given judgment, which is the topic of the essay.

Example of an outline of an essay on social studies

Introduction.

Identification of the main idea of the quotation. Relevance of the problem.

The disposition to the author's idea.

Argumentation on refutation or confirmation of the author's idea.

Improvement of the author's idea.

Comparative analysis of the author's idea with other thoughts. Give examples.

Conclusion.

Tips for scoring a high score

From the options offered, choose only a quote that you have no difficulty in understanding and have a clear plan of further action.

Select examples from the course of literature, and examples that you have learned from reading works outside the school curriculum. You may also use examples you heard on TV, on the radio, and from people you know. Examples should also be written down briefly on a piece of paper, so as not to forget about them at the right moment.

Due to the fact that essay writing in social studies is not assessed for literacy, composition, and style, there is no point in writing a full draft and then rewriting it again on a clean sheet. You can limit yourself to making a plan and those outlines written above.
